Are You Devoted to Fellowship?

I've been thinking a lot about fellowship lately. It started off simple enough when I was part of a conversation about Sunday fellowship after worship. It seemed to me that people were less enthusiastic about fellowship than they use to be. There was even a suggestion specifically not to bake but to just bring bought cookies. Now this is just me but to relax, I love to bake, while I know there are others who like to bake as well, I also know some others feel they can't participate in fellowship anymore because they are not able to bake like they use to. Now I've admitted I like to bake so I disagreed with just buying a package of cookies to bring for Sunday fellowship.

Well, I was wrong!

Once I really started to think about it, sitting down after worship on Sunday visiting with others, was mainly about sharing a laugh or two, sometimes exchanging or sharing ideas, on occasion even discussing the homily. It had very little to do with the cookies. It was about being with people. Fellow members who have the same core beliefs, values as I do. The cookies and tea just give us an excuse to sit and share in fellowship. I'll be honest I love home baking, but I would stay for fellowship even without any refreshments. Then I started to think about how much I missed being at church and fellowship during the early days of Covid. From there it became a question of why is fellowship so important. What is 'fellowship'.

Fellowship

Is it the church hall or fellowship hall? Could fellowship be a potluck dinner? Or maybe a fish fry or a pork dinner? Is it bible study or a book study? Could it be welcoming a new comer to the area. Yes, it could be any and all of these.



The more I thought about it the more my view or ideas expanded. Why do we join certain groups or play certain sports or go to certain summer camps? The only camps I have every gone to have been church camps or a group camp associated with a certain church. Why are we sent to these types of camps? Of course, we know our families wanted us to associate with like minded children with similar values or belief systems. Or we join a sports club, we could play basketball in our driveway but the real fun the pleasure comes from sharing, learning and challenging our peers – fellowship with others who enjoy similar things.

My old Thorndike – Barnhart Dictionary defines fellowship as companionship; a taking part with others; group of people having similar tastes or interest. The Oxford dictionary is very





similar a feeling of friendship between people who do things together or share an interest especially in religious groups.

One of the first things I remember enjoying when we first moved to the Bruce was Worship 2000 in the park, here in Wiarton. The churches here meet monthly and raise money for the local foodbank and for a winter heat program. They work together to organize and share in an Advent Lunch each year and annual Lenten lunches as well as the big summer get together down at Bluewater Park. The group is the Wiarton Interfaith Group or WIG. It is one of the best things we do here each year as 'church' to be in community together – fellowship. We certainly don't believe in all the same doctrine or have the same ideas about how to do church, but our core beliefs are the same.

Fellowship was such an important part of the first century church. I believe it was one of the main reasons for its exponential growth. Fellowship builds relationships that strengthen our faith, even those non-formal fellowship opportunities. The early Christians met day by day in the temple, and were eating meals in each others homes daily. They were devoted to fellowship.

Are we missing something here? Could, it be that in order for us to have the kind of growth that the early church did, we must again devote ourselves to fellowship with one another inviting the wider community in. We are slowly building these relationships or fellowships with other denominations. Just recently I read how we, Lutherans and Anglicans are now in full communion with the Moravians. That's very exciting news.

Sometimes, of course, we may feel others from other denominations or even our own denomination can be a pain, they might even irritate us, we might disagree with some of their practices or their ideas, what they say or do. I have known individuals who have said enough! And walked away while others have just slowly drifted away. We might think that the church is not meeting our needs and that worshipping and praying or meditating on our own would be better. For awhile it may work, but what about your needs; or the future of church.

Our fellowship is a witness to the community or lack of fellowship is a blight on our community.

Looking at the bigger picture fellowship reinforces our beliefs; it helps to strengthen who we are.

Fellowship changes our relationship to God from I to We. We can pass on our knowledge, our learning to others.... building God's family. We learn from each other; we improve with encouragement from others.

This is why Christian fellowship is so important and a basic element of Christianity. Without fellowship with other Christians how could we grow or spur others on to Christian growth?

In the New Testament the Greek word for fellowship is Koinonia. This word expresses the idea of being together for mutual benefit. Fellowship with God and fellowship with other Christians. In Hebrews 10:24-25, 'And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching'.





Fellowship is also needed for emotional support. Knowing that others are there for us when we are in need; be it physical injury, emotional crisis, or even a crisis of faith. It is good to know others are there for us and we are there for others, ready to offer our help in whatever form is needed.

Fellowship is you! It isn't just coming together to exchange niceties, to talk about the weather or sports or even to get together for a meal. While all of these are enjoyable and fun to do being a part of Christian Fellowship is so much more. To be in Christian Fellowship is to be in community with each other. You support one another, you build each other up in our relationship with God. You extend your help to others beyond our faith community to the best of our individual abilities.



On Tuesday December 12th we held a PPC meeting specifically to again review/revise the budget. Our Wardens, Co-Chairs, Pastor members of PPC and myself as Treasurer have put in a lot of work to make this a doable budget. It will be brought forward for your approval at our Annual Congregational expanded Laamb meeting and the Anglican Parish Annual Vestry. So, everyone has a chance to review, discuss and have a say in the budget's approval. We are all aware of how costs keep going up. We are looking at all of our options to control expenses or to reduce their impact. All options, have been considered including discussions with the Diocese on their apportionment. The reworking of numbers and capital being withdrawn from Trinity Church Building Trust Fund.




